- 2 ACP Policy Statement Concerning MOC as a Prerequisite for Licensure and Credentialing (2014)
- 3 The American College of Physicians (ACP), the national organization for internal medicine
- 4 specialists and subspecialists, has a stated mission "to enhance the quality and effectiveness of
- 5 health care by fostering excellence and professionalism in the practice of medicine." In
- **6** supporting this mission, ACP recognizes the importance of certification and the professional
- 7 (responsibility of physicians for maintaining competence and for continuous professional
- 8 development throughout their career.
- 9 ACP encourages participation in the American Board of Internal Medicine's Maintenance of
- 10 Certification (MOC) program. Participation in MOC provides evidence of quality and
- 11 commitment to continuous professional development, but it is not the only way to
- 12 demonstrate these qualities. Consequently, ACP does <u>not</u> support using participation in MOC as
- 13 an absolute prerequisite for state licensure, hospital credentialing, or insurer credentialing.
- 14 Instead, decisions about licensure and credentialing should be based on the physician's
- 15 performance in his or her practice setting and a broader set of criteria for assessing
- 16 competence, professionalism, commitment to continuous professional development, and
- 17 quality of care provided. By understanding that a wide variety of attributes contribute to a
- 18 physician's competence and quality of care, ACP stresses that the physician's demonstrated
- 19 performance for providing high quality, compassionate care and his or her commitment to
- 20 continuous professional development should be the primary determinants for licensure and
- 21 credentialing.
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
