### RESOLUTIONS

## <u>C-1 – National Disaster Healthcare Volunteer Initiative (ADOPTED)</u>

RESOLVED, that the WSMA work with the state congressional delegation to encourage bi-partisan sponsorship in the Senate for the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) laws as amended and passed in the house (Directive to Take Action); and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the WSMA AMA Delegation encourage the AMA to support bi-partisan sponsorship and passage of EMAC laws through their legislative activities. # <u>C-2 – Recognize NBPAS Board Certification as Equal Alternative to ABMS MOC and Recertification Process (ADOPTED AS AMENDED)</u>

RESOLVED, that the WSMA will support alternative pathways for board recertification (i.e. NBPAS) and maintenance of certification; and

Proposed reforms should be evaluated using criteria in WSMA policy and also articulated by the Institute of Medicine, summarized as: universal, continuous, affordable (for individuals and families), sustainable (for society as a whole), and providing high quality health care, with a full report presented to the House of Delegates next year.
